
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In the last 25 years, eight frog species have become fully extinct and several more are likely to become extinct in the near future. SAVE THE FROGS! is an international team of scientists, educators, policymakers and naturalists dedicated to protecting the world's amphibian species: the frogs, toads, salamanders, and caecilians. So, in 2008, Dr. Kerry Kriger founded SAVE THE FROGS! with a mission to protect amphibian populations and to promote a society that respects and appreciates nature and wildlife. To date, SAVE THE FROGS! staff and volunteers have organized well over 2,000 educational events in at least 57 countries; helped enact federal, state and local legislation on behalf of amphibians; and created, restored and protected critical wetland habitats. And since then, it has been Sarbani Nag. Since 2009, India has been one of the most active countries in the SAVE THE FROGS! This organization have worked immensely for conservation of frogs. From organizing campaign to various programs continuously promoting awareness regarding frogs. They are also working hard day and night to save these cute creatures. Their campaign happen in almost every state, and they are trying their level best to save them. So, I would like to thank the entire team of Save the Frogs India for giving us an opportunity to handle such a great.

The major causes of extinction are -

- Frog leg soup hypothesis: Eating the animal.
- Less moisture making habitat less suitable, increase temperature making habitat hot, change in the timing of wet periods affects frog breeding.
- Introduction of alien species in native water bodies *Gambusia holbrookii* (Mosquito fish) trout, carp and goldfish eat native frog eggs and tadpoles.
- Amphibians are more susceptible to pollution than other groups because their skin is permeable. For this reason, toxins are able to invade critical amphibian organs
- Experimental and field studies suggest that amphibians are highly susceptible to common insecticides, pesticides, and herbicides such as Roundup.
- Illegal trading of amphibians for various purposes like consumption, pet etc, results in spread of various infectious diseases like as the *Chytridiomycosis* caused by *Batrachochytrium dendrobatidis* etc.

- Maintain soil quality.


Reason for participation:

Logo design:

Purpose: Logos are a point of identification; that's why we needed a logo which can represent us to common people. We can also project our thoughts through the logo very easily.

Procedure: For our logo we chose the purple frog. As our moto is to spread awareness so we chose a frog which is an Indian species and listed as Endangered by the IUCN Red List as our logo. The logo is handmade, one of our team members, Pallab Ghosh drew the cartoon version of purple frog with colour pen. After that a picture is taken and then it is edited in Adobe Photoshop. The name of our team, *Team Frogs*, is also shown in the logo. Our target is to save the frogs, to save their dynasty from decline and to let them leave as their own *KING* in amphibian kingdom. That's why we added a *crown* in the logo.









Basic plan:

Our basic plan was to spread awareness within the people of different classes. We targeted mainly 3 types of peoples -

- 1. School students who have very less knowledge about the problem.
- 2. College students who have some understanding of the problem.
- 3. General audience who has no knowledge about it.

Spread awareness within the school students, we had planned a debate and elocution competition. We thought that it would be pretty much easy to make them aware of the problem through a competition. Also, it would be easier for us to understand their point of view. For school students we also planned to organise an online essay competition.

We planned to participate as a group in various competitions, awareness campaigns and seminars where students of different colleges all over the state are present. So, we can convey our thoughts to many people. We also planned to organise a intra college quiz competition, prepare a model (about how amphibians can be conserved), make some leaflets and distribute them within the students.

For public, we decided to create a Facebook page and an Instagram page where we can post many things to aware general public. As social media is a fantastic way to spread our message within a lot of people, so we had to take it very seriously and carefully.

Events:

Every event that we had conducted had its own importance and the result had given propitious view in future.

The following events that we followed-out are where debate, elocution, essay aims to aware all these participants who in turn spread our message of conversance about frogs.

- Essay: The proposal for this event was to procure the beautiful ideas about frogs.
- Debate: This event had ignited probable questions about near future of the frogs and their consequences among the youth.
- Elocution: Through this it had been estimated the measurement of knowledge of the primary students concerning the frog.



The following events we participated in various programmes where we tried to enkindle our epistle of awareness among all.

- Speech in ZSI: On auspicious occasions of World Biodiversity Day, we were lucky to represent ourselves to spread awareness through that medium.
- Fair at Madhyamgram: This programme gave us the freedom to keep our viewpoint in front of general public comprising all age groups from different milieu and authorities.
- Model competition at South girls' Calcutta college: This event aims at easier way for precepting the conservation methods of frogs that can be implemented in near future and the promoting awareness among participated participants.

Programme details:

• Elocution Competition:

We have organized an elocution Competition for school students, on 22nd August 2022, at our college campus. Two topics were there -

- 1. Frogs makes a promise to save ecosystem and nature.
- 2. A sustainable way of approach near future can help the frogs to thrive.

Nine Students from three schools participated and we awarded the best of one participant per topic. Judges were Dr. Pradyut Kumar Medda and Mr. Samir Sardar, professors at our college. Members of team frogs (Tribikram sur, Sayan Das, Soham Samanta, Raktim Pal) conducted the elocution competition. We made a slide that was full of facts about frogs, which we showed between the speeches of two competitions.



• Debate Competition:

We have organized a debate Competition for school students, on 22nd August 2022, at our college campus. Two topics were there -

- 1. Save the Frog: Is the cup half empty or half full?
- 2. Is awareness only way to save a species from extinction in today's pertaining situation?

12 Students or 6 groups (2 students each group) from three schools participated, and we awarded the best of one group per topic. Judges were Dr. Debakumar Dutta and Mr. Koutilya Bhattacharya, professors at our college. Members of team frogs (Ankit Bhattacharya, Sourav Chatterjee, Kunal Roy, Ritam Kumar Meddya, Pallab Ghosh) conducted the debate Competition.





• Online Essay Competition:

We have organized an online essay competition for school students, students submitted their essay within a Google form, that form opened from 1st September to 20th October 2022. Two topics were there for different classes -

- 1. "Frogs in day-to-day life" for class five to eight.
- 2. "Autobiography of a frog" for class nine to twelve.

A good response came from the students. **Around 65 students from 33 schools submitted their essays and took part in that event**. Our message reached 100 schools through that competition. After our preliminary checking, the final check was done by Dr. Tanmoy Paul and Mr. Samir Sardar, professors at our college. They selected the best of 5 essays from each topic, and we gave them online certificates. All Members of team frogs conducted this program. We posted all competitions winners name in our official Facebook page "Team Frogs RKMVC College".

KGF is obviously a trending name. And we believe that every kind of person from every part of society will accept our 'Movie poster ' and we can reach a lot of audience.




Madhyamgram Poribesh Sochetonota Mela:





Future goals:

"The obstacles we face are mental barriers which can be broken by adopting a more positive approach."


